

# A LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



75 years ago, on August 26, 1947, Dorothy Darby Smith and other visionary founders signed the "Agreement of Incorporation" establishing Spokane Civic Theatre Inc. For the past three-quarters of a century, Civic has been Spokane's leading community theatre and a major contributor to the cultural landscape of the city and Inland Northwest.

Initially, Civic operated out of a number of downtown Spokane venues, including the Post Theater and Riverside Playhouse. In 1967, we opened our newly constructed facility on Howard Street. This dream come true was made possible by the unrelenting efforts of our leadership, coupled with the generous support of our patrons and the Spokane community. In the ensuing years, our facility was upgraded, including the addition of a second stage in 1972, the 96-seat black box Studio Theatre, named after longstanding Board member and legendary fundraiser, Firth J. Chew. Since moving to Howard Street, we have mounted more than 500 productions, averaging 180 performances each season, along with conducting innumerable performing arts classes, predominantly for the youth of our community.

We celebrate our 75th anniversary at a time of burgeoning growth on the North Bank. With many dining, entertainment and recreation options, development in our area, including the outdoor downtown stadium, is booming. While we are thrilled to be in the midst of this transformation, where the potential for collaboration is ripe, we recognize that this growth requires us to soundproof our facility. Concurrently, this moment presents a golden opportunity for us to renovate our fifty year-old building and create more space for more art, artists and educational opportunities. To this end, we introduce 1CIVIC, our capital campaign meant to render our renovation plans — developed with Cortner Architecture and Trane Technologies — a reality. A successful campaign will fund facility-wide soundproofing and full ADA accessibility, an additional 7,100 square feet for rehearsal and educational space, redesigned environmental and mechanical controls, and improved production and technology capabilities.

We ask that each of you take this opportunity to participate in 1CIVIC and ensure a vibrant Civic for tomorrow. Whether you give \$10 or a million, your contribution will be greatly appreciated: ONECIVIC.COM.

With a successful capital campaign, it will be necessary for us to move our programming to offsite venues until construction is completed. In the meantime, we celebrate Civic's 75th Season with an extraordinary lineup, including timeless classics, acclaimed new plays, contemporary musicals, regional premieres, original works by local and regional writers, and more. Join us and experience a year of adventure, courage, discovery, and the limitless power of imagination. Help us lay the groundwork for the next chapter in the remarkable journey of Spokane Civic Theatre.



STEVEN SATER won Tony Awards for Best Book and Best Score, as well as the Grammy Award, both the NY and UK Drama Critics' Circle, and the Olivier Award for Best New Musical for Spring Awakening. A revival of Spring Awakening, produced by Deaf West Theatre, was Tony-nominated for Best Musical Revival. The recent Almeida Theatre revival received the London Critics' Circle Theatre Award for Best Musical. In November 2021, the original Broadway cast reunited for a one-night benefit, which is now the subject of the HBO documentary, Spring Awakening: Those You've Known. Jessie wrote, directed and produced Corrina Corrina and I Am Sam staring Sean Penn, who received an Academy Award nomination for his performance. Among her other directing credits are Curb Your Enthusiasm and Love, the Coopers with Diane Keaton. Her writing credits include Step Mom and The Story of Us. She produced Fred Claus and Danny Collins . In London, Jessie directed Alice By Heart which she co-wrote with Steven Sater with music by Duncan Sheik at the National Theater Connections Program and again at MCC in NYC. She began her career as an actress at the Public Theater working with the award-winning experimental theater Mabou Mines and at the New York Shakespeare Festival. She wrote the children's book Labracadabra. She has been the artistic Director of the Sundance Screen Writers Lab.

**DUNCAN SHEIK** is a Grammy and Tony Award-winning artist who launched his career in 1996 with his Grammy nominated self-titled debut album. Sheik is the composer for the critically acclaimed musical Spring Awakening, which went on to win eight Tony Awards in 2007, including awards for Best Orchestrations and Best Original Score. The album earned Sheik a Grammy Award for Best Musical Show Album. In years since, Sheik has released multiple albums, most recently Claptrap in 2022 and American Psycho: Original London Cast Recording, with lyrics and music written by Sheik, premiered in the U.S. on Broadway in 2016 after a sold-out London run. His most recent theater projects include Alice By Heart, The Secret Life of Bees, Because of Winn Dixie, Bob & Carol & Ted & Alice, Nero, and Noir.



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
