

Spokane Civic Theatre's home on Howard Street has been a creative haven for some and a source of community and entertainment for others. In recent years, development in our area—downtown Spokane's North Bank neighborhood—has boomed. In spring 2020, when plans were released for the 5,000+ seat outdoor downtown stadium (140 feet east of Civic's facility), Civic Board Members and management went to task, researching soundproofing solutions and exploring long—overdue renovation ideas, determined to illuminate a bright future for Civic.



Together, with Cortner Architecture and Trane Technologies, we have developed 1CIVIC—a capital campaign meant to render critical soundproofing and renovation plans a reality.

# **PROJECT PRIORITIES**


- » Exterior and interior soundproofing, cementing operability of Civic's 27,00 square foot facility
- » Property-sprawling ADA accessibility
- » More efficient and sustainable environmental and mechanical systems
- » A 7,300 square foot addition to aid in soundproofing and provide dedicated space for education
- » Relocate Studio Theatre entrance from east to south side of facility for east side soundproofing
- » Replace numerous areas of roof with soundproofing materials and improve production capabilities

# With a \$12-15 million budget
